

Habari za asubuhi! Greetings from Tanzania!

What an amazing country, Am DIGGING into (!) SOIL here. Did you know soil contains two to three times more carbon than the atmosphere? That means that small changes in soil carbon - improvement or deterioration — can have a really big impact on climate change. And, I just learnt about this practice called "ngitili," a Sukuma tribal word meaning "enclosure" or "Fodder reserve". Naitili means closing off grasses, shrubs, and trees from livestock from the beginning to the end of the rainy season. You then open-up the land for grazing at the peak of the dry season. During the wet season, this prevents soil erosion and helps out the wildlife too. Soil is potentially a massive climate solution.
